Dear Mr. Quinn:

Believe me, your concern about the press and media is shared by many of us in public life. I have been talking with editors around the country and particularly with the editor of the biggest paper here in Washington pointing out that unless something is done to reestablish the American's faith in the news media, they could well lose the freedom of the press.

To really appreciate the abuse that news is receiving, you have to live in Washington where the news is made and you hear it made on the Floor of the Senate or the House or the remarks of the President and then read what is said about it the next day, and you wonder if you really heard what you thought you did or not. I am going to keep trying to get them to straighten out. All I ask is objectivity: I don't want the news slanted at any direction, just toward the truth.
